#### 4. RULES

- a. The tournament shall be governed by the General Rules and Regulations of AOPC 2025 Player's Handbook.
- b. Unless otherwise stated, we shall be adopting USA Pickleball (USAP) 2025 Official Rulebook: <https://usapickleball.org/docs/2025-USA-Pickleball-Rulebook.pdf>
- c. Players may use USAP-approved paddle that is posted on the USAP website (<https://equipment.usapickleball.org/paddle-list/>)
- d. Official will randomly check at the beginning and when you change paddle during the games. We shall apply [2.F.1.a. 1-3] for any violation.
- e. Players may use UPA-A (<https://upaa.unitedpickleball.com/>) approved paddle on <https://upaa.unitedpickleball.com/paddle-testing/>
- f. If you do not have an approved paddle, the tournament official will lend you an approved paddle for your matches. You shall not demand for brand and model of your choice.



- g. The official tournament ball is USAP-approved **Diadem Premier Power Pickleballs (NEON GREEN)**.
- h. All games (singles/doubles/team challenge) will follow the USAP scoring rule; serve to win a point. This is not a rally-scoring game.
- i. All matches will be officiated by Referees.

### 6. TOURNAMENT FORMAT (INDIVIDUAL EVENT - SINGLES & DOUBLES)

- a. The tournament format will consist of 2 rounds: -
  - Round 1 – Round Robin**
    - i. Each Round Robin's Group shall be a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 5.
    - ii. Top 2 teams from each group will be promoted to Round 2.
    - iii. Game to 11 for all Junior/ Int/ Adv/ Open matches. End change after scoring 6. No deuce. First to reach 11 wins.
  - Round 2 & thereafter – Single Elimination, Quarters & Semis**
    - i. Junior/Int/Adv: **Game to 11**. End change after scoring 6. No deuce. First to reach 11 wins.
    - ii. Open: **Game to 15 points**. End change after scoring 8. No deuce. First to reach 15 wins.
- b. **Medal Match (GOLD medal match | BRONZE medal match):**
  - i. **Junior/Int/Adv:** Game to 15 points. End change after scoring 8. No deuce. First to reach 15 wins.
  - ii. **Open:** 3 games to 11 points. No deuce, first to reach 11 wins.
    - Game 1 & 2 no End change. In Game 3, End change after scoring 6.
    - Best of 3 games. The first team to win two games is the winner of the match.
- c. In the case where a division with only 1 round-robin group: -
  - i. **For Junior & Intermediate:** 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> position will be determined by the round-robin results.
  - ii. **For Advanced & Open (Prize Money):** The first 2 teams from the Round Robin shall play the **GOLD medal match:** Refer to point 6b (3 games to 11 points).
  - iii. **For Advanced & Open (Prize money): 3rd position** will be determined by the round-robin results.
- d. In each game, each team is allowed to have 1 time-out, max 1 minute each. In game of 15 points, each team will be allowed to have 2-time outs. [10.A & 10.A.1]



- e. All matches shall be refereed. Line judges will be made available for only semis and finals matches in the Open division. The referee will record the score.
- f. A Technical Officer (TO) is assigned to each zone to oversee the match. Any dispute can be raised to the Technical officer on duty. In case the dispute is not resolved then the Tournament Director may be called. The decision of the Tournament Director will be final.
- g. Tournament Director (Referee) may at his sole discretion assign officials or include additional officials to officiate any matches. This can be done before the match commences or during the match.
- h. Tie Resolution – Tie during the Round Robin matches shall be resolved following USAP rulebook section 12.C.4.

### 8. TOURNAMENT FORMAT (TEAM CHALLENGE)

- a. Team Challenge will consist of 2 rounds,
  - i. **Round 1** - Round Robin
    - Each Round Robin Group shall be a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 4.
    - The top 2 teams from each round-robin group will promote to Round 2
  - ii. **Round 2** - Single Elimination
- b. In case of one division of 5 teams, the team will play round robin The first 2 teams from the Round Robin shall play the **GOLD medal match**.
- c. Each Team Match consists of 4 games: -

- i. Games 1 & 2 will be played concurrently followed by Games 3 & 4.
- ii. Game to 15 points. End change after scoring 8. No deuce. First to reach 15 wins.
- iii. The team who scored 5 game points, wins the team match.
- d. Team captain may submit different team player line-ups in different matches.
- b. The 4 games line-up must be submitted to the tournament desk 15 min before the scheduled time of the match. Each player can participate maximum 2 games in a match.
- c. We shall apply the same point 6d – 6i for the Team Challenge.

### 9. MEDALS

- a. Medals (Gold, Silver, and Bronze) shall be awarded to all divisions (Singles, Doubles and Team Game). For Team Game, there is a maximum of 8 medals.
- b. Trophy shall be awarded to the Team Challenge Champion.



- c. The Prize presentation ceremony shall be held soon after the final. All prize winners must be present personally at the ceremony in neat attire.

#### We reserve the rights in our discretion on Prize money depending on the followings:

Divisions with at least 16 players/teams - 100% of the initial prize money

Divisions with 12-15 players/teams - 75% of the initial prize money

Divisions with 6-11 players/teams - 50% of the initial prize money

Divisions with less than 6 players/teams – Medals & Certificates





The prize money is subject to deduction as applicable under the Indian Tax law. While we certainly appreciate the support of all of you, we want to stay prudent in our accounting and we hope you will all understand this.

### 12. SUPPLEMENTARY RULES

- a. The AOPC Tournament Directors reserve the right to amend the rules and regulations or reschedule the fixtures of the tournament at any time as it deems fit. The decision on all such matters shall be final. Participants will be informed via the AFP website before the start of the tournament or during the games.
- b. All players must report to the tournament desk at least **30 minutes before the scheduled match**. Players should wait for your match announcement.
- c. Player shall concede a walkover if the player is not on the court after the grace period.
  - i. 10 min – 1<sup>st</sup> game forfeit if the match is best of 3 games.
  - ii. 15 min – Match forfeit (for 1 game match or 3 games match).
  - iii. The max point shall be awarded to the other team player/s who is/are present on the court.
- d. In all Non-Officiated Play, the server (or the partner) should call out the score. The opponent should echo back the score. The hand signal is allowed.
- e. Medical Timeout – Refer to rulebook 10.B.1.a. We will amend as: “When medical personnel or the Referee arrive, the Technical Officer or Referee shall start the 15- minute timer.”
- f. Injury or retired: In the event of a sustained injury, you may choose to retire from a match. If this happens, your score at the point of retiring from the match shall remain status quo while your opponent shall be awarded the maximum point. You shall be allowed to resume the rest of the scheduled matches if you are well enough to continue.
- g. All protests shall be made in writing accompanied by a protest fee of USD\$100.00 and must be lodged in person to the organising committee before the end of the game day. No protest will be entertained thereafter.
- h. You grant AFP, AIPA and its officials the rights to take videos and pictures during the tournament. All information we obtain will be used for publicity and the promotion purpose of the sport.
- i. During the tournament, photography, and video recording by the public or individual are prohibited. However, personal capture for non-commercial purposes is permissible. The organizers do not guarantee privacy protection for individuals. Capturing others' images entails personal risk. Any personal or friend-captured media involving others is undertaken at one's own risk. Organizers should not be held liable for individual actions.

Nearest Airport - Rajiv Gandhi International Airport, Hyderabad (28 km). Hire an Ola/Uber from the airport.

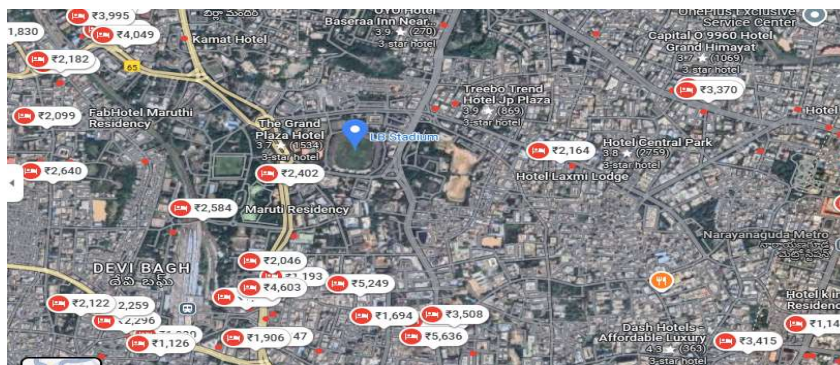
Nearest Railway Station – Hyderabad Deccan or Nampally Railway Station (1.5 km)

### Charminar

Charminar stands tall in the heart of the city since 1591. It was built by Mohammed Quli Qutub Shah reflecting CaZIA style. Charminar's unique architecture and detailed design with four 48.7 meter high minarets used to warn the king's men, is something to marvel at! 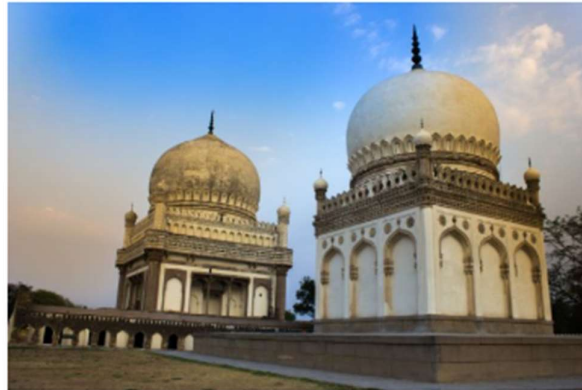
### **Qutub Shahi Tombs**
